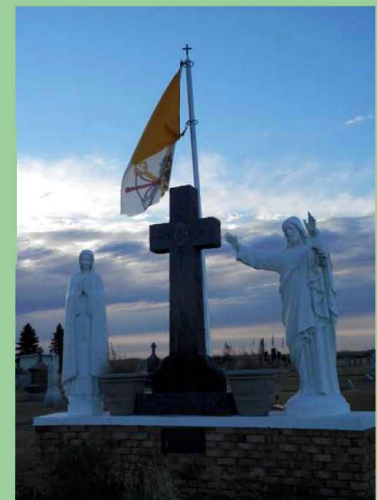




Calvary Cemetery

Wahpeton, North Dakota



Rules and Regulations

St. John's Church of Wahpeton, ND is part of the Diocese of Fargo and is a religious corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of North Dakota. St. John's Church owns and operates Calvary Cemetery.

Title to the land in any lot in Calvary Cemetery shall remain in ownership of St. John's Church. Persons desiring to be buried in Calvary Cemetery shall purchase Burial Rights. No Burial Rights shall be sold in joint ownership. Title shall stand in one name. No money will be refunded when Burial Rights are deeded back to St. John's Church.

Cost of Burial Rights at Calvary Cemetery are \$400.00 per grave.

St. John's Church shall have the right to enlarge, reduce, replot or change boundaries of Calvary Cemetery, or sections of Calvary Cemetery, to change locations of roads, gutters, pipe lines, et cetera, without notice to holders of Burial Rights.

The right to interment in a lot shall be granted only to holders of Burial Rights. St. John's Church reserves the right to refuse to permit the interment of anyone who was not at the time of death the

holder of Burial Rights or a relative of the holder. In all other cases, written permission of the holder of Burial Rights shall be required by St. John's Church before interment shall be made.

Purchased lots that have no activity for 30 years and no living relatives can be contacted, will have ownership of Burial Rights revert back to St. John's Church.

INTERMENTS

Calvary Cemetery will be open for interments at reasonable hours every day of the year, providing burial conditions are feasible.

The burial of the infant may take place on the top of a grave or between graves of a deceased relative.

Cremains may be buried in Calvary Cemetery on existing grave spaces. Only 2 Cremains per grave are allowed. There will be a \$ 150.00 charge for each Cremains burial.

All Cremains are required to use a minimum of a concrete box.

No burials will be conducted before May 15th unless ground conditions are suitable for burial.

GENERAL CARE OF LOTS

The general care of Calvary Cemetery shall be assumed by St. John's Church. General care will consist of cutting the grass at reasonable intervals, the pruning of shrubs and trees, replacement of soil on individual lots, reseeding and watering of grass and the general preservation of the property.

General care will not include the care of monuments and markers.

Planting of trees shall be completed by St. John's Church.

Monument Companies are responsible for any damage to any Cemetery property or headstones, while installing markers. Monument Companies must make arrangements with St. John's Church prior to any installation.
